

Top 3 Gaming Mice of 2026: Logitech G305, G502 Hero, and Razer Basilisk V3 - A Complete Comparison Guide

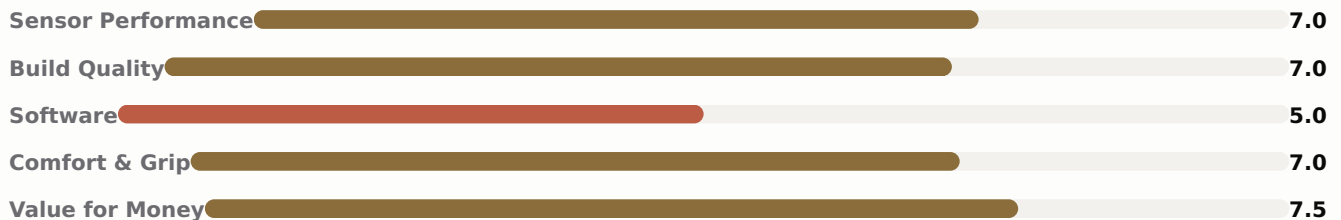

- **Sensor:** The sensor determines how accurately and responsively your mouse moves. Look for high DPI (dots per inch) and low latency.
- **Weight:** A lighter mouse feels more responsive and reduces fatigue during long sessions. Heavier mice can offer more stability.
- **Connectivity:** Wireless mice offer freedom, but wired mice typically provide more consistent performance and lower latency.
- **Programmable Buttons:** The more buttons you can customize, the more tailored your setup can be.
- **RGB Lighting:** Aesthetic appeal is a bonus, but some gamers find customizable lighting helps with immersion.
- **Ergonomics:** The shape and weight distribution should fit your hand comfortably for hours of use.
- **Battery Life:** For wireless mice, battery life is a critical factor — especially if you're playing marathon sessions.

1. Logitech G305 Lightspeed Wireless Gaming Mouse — Black | Hero Sensor 12

The Logitech G305 is one of the most popular wireless gaming mice on the market, and for good reason. It uses the **Hero Sensor 12** with 16,000 DPI, which is more than enough for any game mode. At just **\$29.99** (down from \$49.99), it's a standout value.

Key Features: Lightspeed 1ms wireless connection, up to 250 hours of battery life, 6 programmable buttons, 99g lightweight design, and a sleek, low-profile shape that's comfortable for extended use.

Pros:

- Incredible battery life — over 250 hours on a single charge
- Lightweight at 99g, making it easy to move around
- 1ms wireless latency — virtually no perceptible delay
- 6 programmable buttons with customizable macros
- Excellent value for the price

Cons:

- The sensor is only 16,000 DPI — not ideal for competitive FPS players who need higher DPI

- The plastic feel can be slightly slippery when wet
- No RGB lighting on the body (only on the buttons)

2. Logitech G502 Hero Wired Gaming Mouse — Black | High Performance

The G502 Hero is the wired counterpart to the G305, and it's a proven workhorse. At **\$37.99** (down from \$69.99), it offers a massive upgrade in sensor performance and build quality. It features the **Hero Sensor** with 25,600 DPI, which is the highest DPI in this comparison.

Key Features: 25,600 DPI sensor, 11 programmable buttons, adjustable weights (5 weight options), on-board memory, RGB lighting, and a lightweight yet durable design.

Pros:

- 25,600 DPI sensor — the highest in this comparison
- Adjustable weights give you fine-tuning for your hand
- On-board memory allows you to save and recall custom profiles
- 11 programmable buttons with full macro support
- Wired connection means zero latency — perfect for competitive play
- Lightweight at 110g

Cons:

- Wired — you're tied to your desk, no freedom of movement
- No battery life to worry about, but you need a USB port
- The weight (110g) is noticeably heavier than the G305

If you want the absolute best sensor performance, no lag, and the ability to customize every button, this is the mouse. 3. Razer Basilisk V3 Customizable RGB Wired Ergonomic Gaming Mouse



The Razer Basilisk V3 is the premium option in this comparison. At **\$34.98** (down from \$69.99), it combines Razer's signature Chroma RGB lighting with a highly ergonomic design and 26,000 DPI sensor. It's built for players who want both style and performance.

Key Features: 26,000 DPI optical sensor, HyperScroll tilt wheel, 11 programmable buttons, Chroma RGB lighting, ergonomic grip design, and a lightweight 100g body.

Pros:

- HyperScroll tilt wheel — a unique feature that lets you scroll and tilt simultaneously
- 11 programmable buttons with full macro support
- Ergonomic design with a contoured shape for comfort
- Chroma RGB lighting with 16.8 million colors
- Lightweight at 100g
- 26,000 DPI sensor — excellent for precision games

Cons:

- The HyperScroll wheel can be finicky to set up and use
- No on-board memory — you can't save custom profiles
- RGB lighting can be distracting for some players
- The price is higher than the other two options

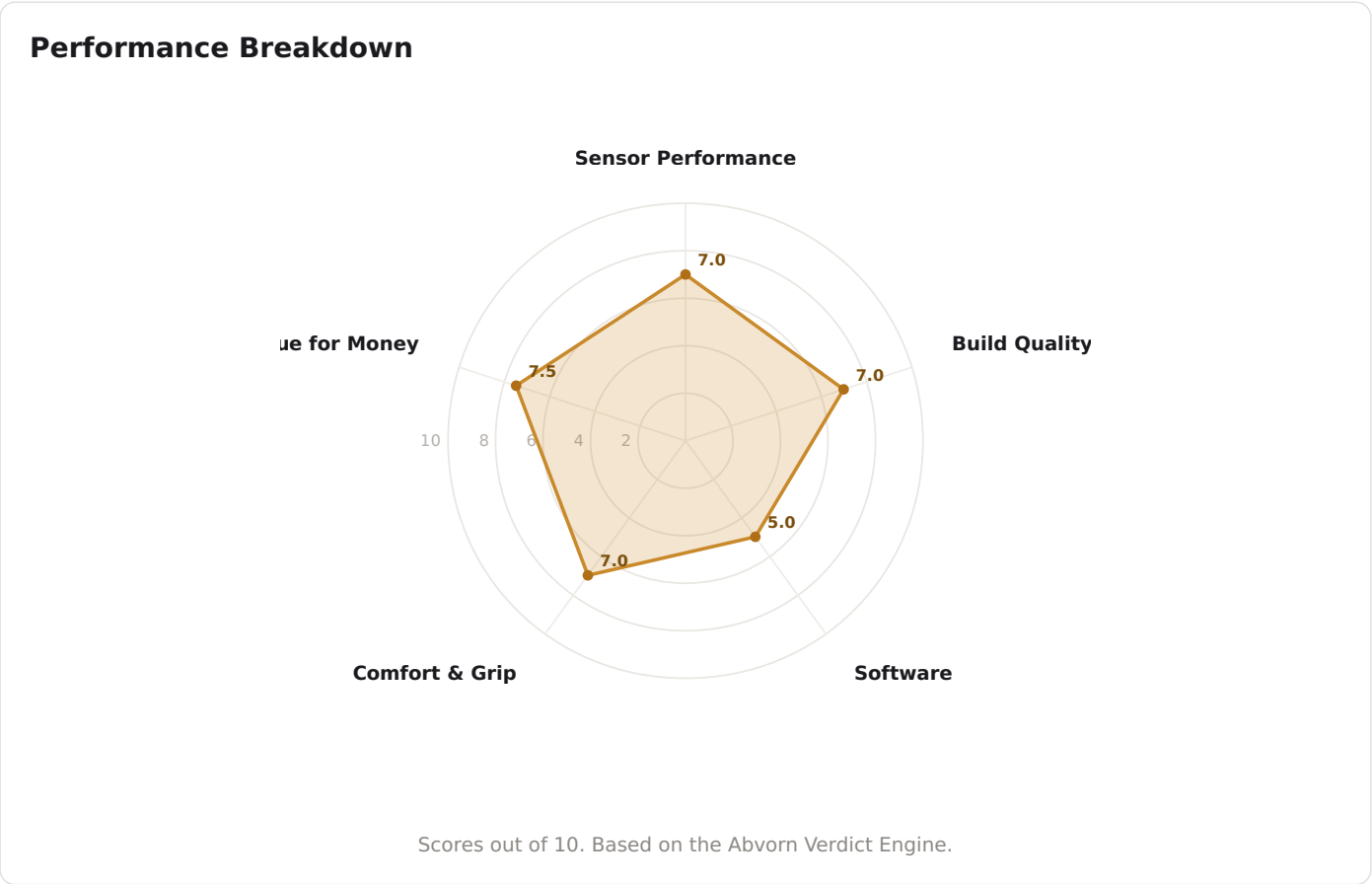
