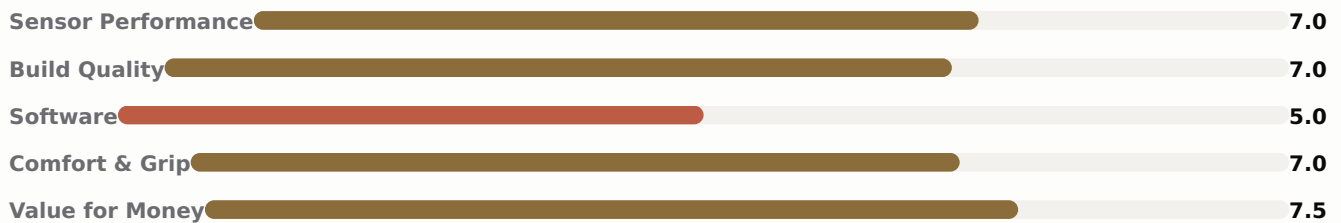

If you're in a competitive environment where every millisecond counts, wired is still the safest bet. However, the wireless options are now virtually indistinguishable in latency and are excellent for casual or mobile gaming.

- **Logitech G502 Hero** – RGB LEDs with Logitech G HUB control.
- **Razer Basilisk V3** – Full Chroma RGB, highly customizable via Razer Synapse.

- **Redragon M612** – RGB backlighting with 8-zone lighting.

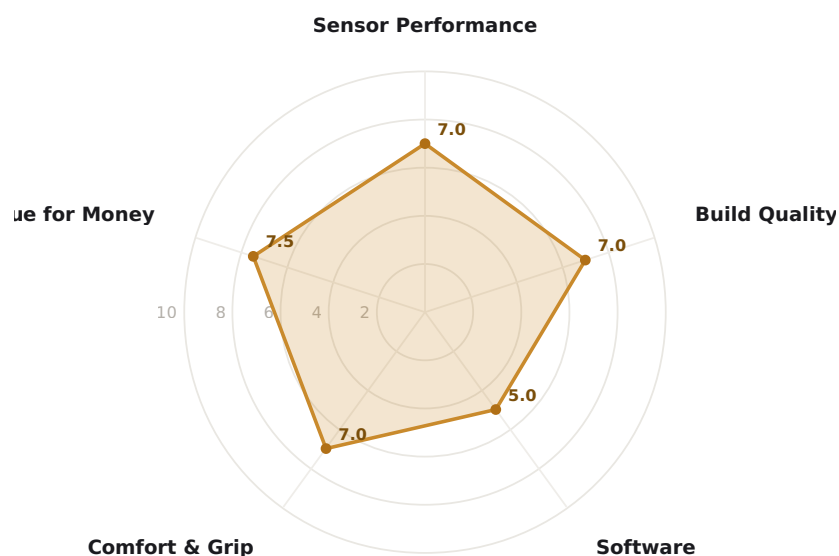
